Packard Health provides high-quality primary and behavioral health care, as well as an array of support services. Founded in 1973 by Dr. Jerry Walden, Packard Health's model of integrated not-for-profit health care has proven successful, especially for patients with complex medical conditions and complicated lives.

- **Neighborhood-based**, to best serve vulnerable populations close to where they live.

The Packard Health Board of Directors and leadership respond.

"Packard has developed a strong and stable operating and financial platform from which to sustain and grow our mission," observed Chuck Hoffman, member of the board of directors. From this position of strength, the board and leadership identified three strategic objectives.

1. Relocate Packard Main to 2650 Carpenter Road in Ann Arbor
2. Open a new practice at 5200 Venture Drive, off South State Street in Pittsfield Township
3. Build prevention and wellness programs available to everyone in our community



2650 Carpenter Road A Critical Move

The Carpenter Road facility is an urgently needed replacement for our original location on Packard Road. Patient visits to the aging and crowded building stood at 15,629 in 2019 and represented 40% of Packard Health's total visits for the same year. Opened in 1973, the facility has far exceeded its design life.

This acquisition was financed in December 2019 with the combination of a bank loan and a down payment saved as part of a financial plan executed to address the needed investment in a replacement facility.

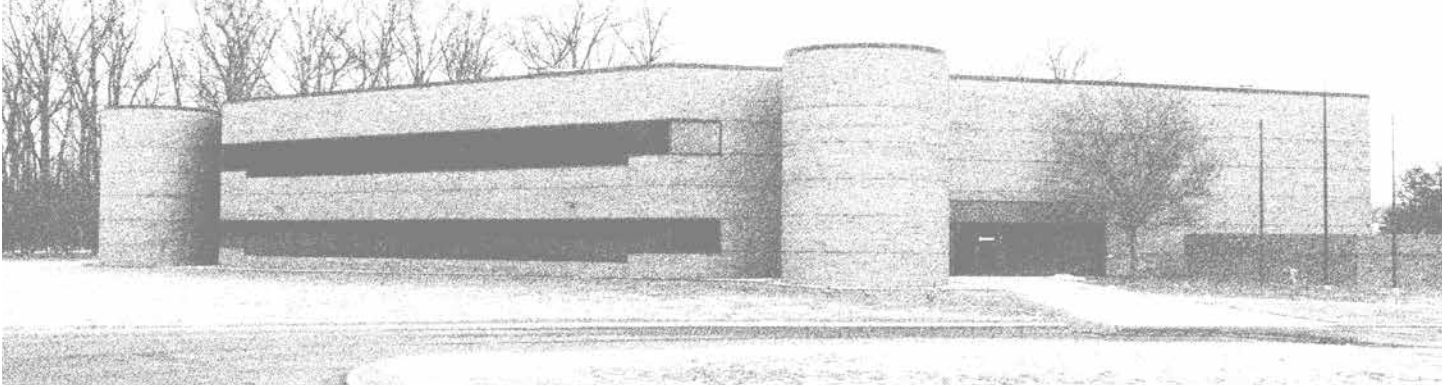
The facility is one mile from the original office, on major bus lines, and has ample parking, making it easily accessible to all in our community.

The Carpenter Road location will:

- Provide care to more people through significantly expanded space and flexible design
- Remove barriers to optimal health through increased space for supportive services such as insurance enrollment; food, transportation, and medication assistance; and an expanded food pantry
- Promote healthy living and learning with a multi-purpose community space
- Create a physically and emotionally safe place that ensures privacy, dignity, and comfort to all

5200 Venture Drive **A Transformative Opportunity**

Richard and Norma Sarns are lifelong proponents of inclusive health and wellness. As longtime supporters of Packard Health, they learned of our critical need for expanded and more suitable space and took action.

In 2019, the Sarns donated a building to Packard Health off South State Street in Ann Arbor. Their visionary gift empowers us to meet the health and wellness needs of our community for generations to come. It enables us to explore and create meaningful and complementary programs and services.

The Venture Drive facility and its surrounding ten acres of green space will be the fourth Packard Health location. Like our three existing locations, it will provide primary and behavioral health care and an array of supportive services.

Preliminary plans for our new campus include:

- Rehabilitation services
- Diabetes and other chronic disease support groups
- Classes on pregnancy, parenting, stress reduction, healthy cooking
- Expanded food pantry
- Horticultural therapy
- Walking trail
- Massage therapy
- Fitness classes
- Community meeting space

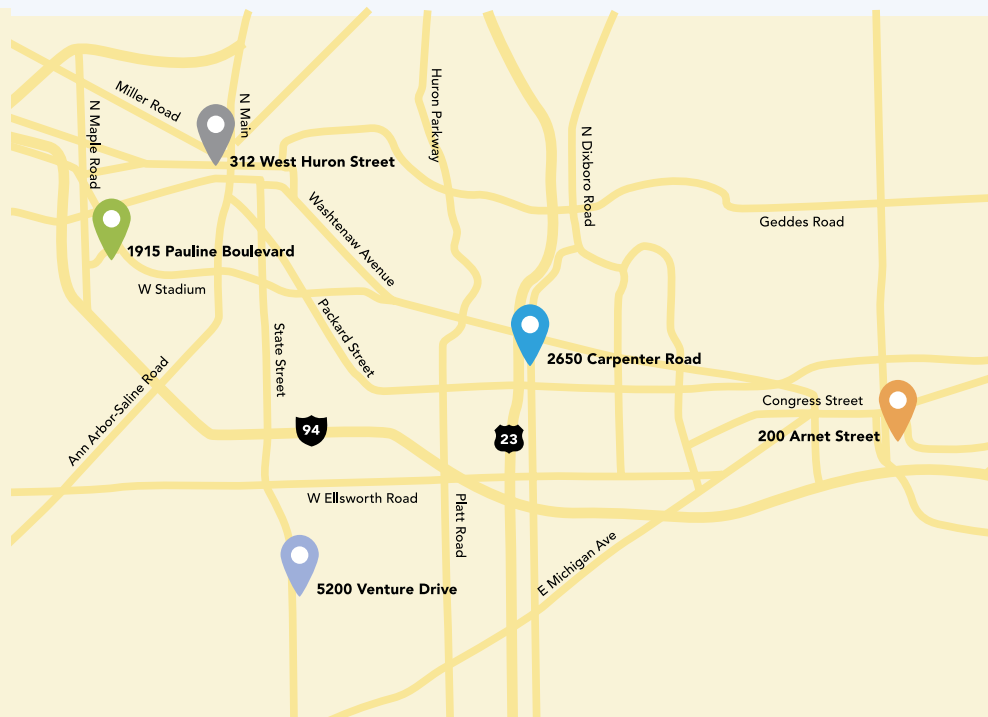

Packard Health Community Clinic was founded by Dr. Jerry Walden with the belief that everyone deserves access to quality health care, including minorities and people without means to pay.

1990

Integrated primary and mental health care and nutrition to treat the whole patient – an innovative model far ahead of its time.

2009

Opened Packard West location during the Great Recession, when unemployment was 10% and many were losing health care insurance, including children.

2014

Earned national recognition as a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC).

2015

Opened Packard Ypsilanti location to serve at-risk, vulnerable populations in their neighborhoods. The expansion was made possible as Packard achieved Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) certification and directed increased funding to the Ypsilanti community.

Launched the Family Shelter Assessment and Referral Program (FSHARP) in collaboration with the Corner Health Center, to provide on-site health care to families in shelters and to connect families to primary care in the community.

2016

Significantly expanded behavioral services in response to our community's mental health services crisis.

Assumed responsibility to run the Shelter Medical Clinic at the Delonis Center.

2017

Launched Medication-Assisted Treatment program in response to our community's growing epidemic of opioid abuse, dependence and overdose.

2018

Expanded outreach services to Avalon Housing's Miller Manor residents to address the specific health challenges faced by chronically homeless and medically vulnerable individuals and families. Expansion included in-home visits at Miller Manor and "bicycle backpack medicine" to clients in apartments throughout the city.

2019

Began providing nursing care for individuals discharged from area hospitals with no home to return to, via the Delonis Center's new Recuperative Care Program.

Purchased the building at 2650 Carpenter Road in Ann Arbor to replace our original main location on Packard Road and expand services.

Received the gift of the building at 5200 Venture Drive in Ann Arbor to establish a fourth location and to empower Packard Health to meet the health and wellness needs of our community for generations to come.
